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

Q. What is the official name of your company?

A.ABUTEC Industries Inc.ABUTEC, an acronym for Advanced Burner Technologies, is a manufacturer of environmentally friendly combustion solutions.

ABUTEC specializes in offering high-efficiency, low-emission burners and flares to various industries, including oil & gas (upstream and midstream), biogas, landfill gas, waste-water treatment, mine gas and many more.ABUTEC manufactures burners, enclosed combustors/flares, vapor combustors, incinerators and thermal oxidizers, all aimed at reducing emissions and increasing efficiency.

Q.What do you most want people to know about your company?

A.ABUTEC manufactures technology that focuses on clean emissions and assistance with regulatory compliance, backed up with unprecedented customer responsiveness.

Q.Where is your company located? A.ABUTEC's worldwide headquarters is located in Atlanta, Georgia, with regional offices and service hubs throughout the U.S.

Q.What year was the company founded and by whom?


A.ABUTEC was founded in 2007 by Andy Smith and Hans van der Pasch.

Q.What is your company's primary business activity?

A.ABUTEC designs and manufactures emissions control devices, including flares, enclosed combustors, VRUs and oilfield services.

Q.Are there important projects the company is currently a part of or has done recently?

A. Upstream Highlight: The ABUTEC 200 has become an integral part of the emissions control process for larger multi-well pads, thanks to its 99 percent



ABUTEC's newest technology, our High Pressure/Low Pressure (HP/LP) Integrated Solution.

DRE. Six ABUTEC 200s are combined to serve as backup combustion devices on a 16-well site with additional storage tanks. These units provide the necessary DRE when the on-site VRUs are offline.

Midstream Highlight: ABUTEC provides unique combustion solutions for rail, truck and barge loading applications. Our High Temperature Flare (HTF) system is designed to maintain high destruction and removal efficiency, in spite of

the varying waste stream gas quality during the loading process. The natural draft design of the HTF eliminates the need for a blower unit, resulting in lower opera-

tional cost, reduced maintenance and significantly lowers system total noise output.

Q. How many employees does your company have?

A.ABUTEC has grown to employ 72 individuals throughout our regional offices and service hubs located in Atlanta, Georgia; Gainesville, Georgia; Chattanooga, Tennessee; Denver, Colorado; Greeley, Colorado; Houston, Texas; Minot,


North Dakota; and Oklahoma City, Oklahoma

Q. Describe the equipment your company manufactures?

A. Product Spotlight: The ABUTECs: ABUTEC's most popular emissions control devices are the ABUTEC 20, ABUTEC 100 and ABUTEC 200. With scalable flow rates of 0-20 MSCFD, 20-100 MSCFD and 100-200 MSCFD respectively, the line of ABUTECs has become a trusted device for sites across the U.S. Each unit is able to be paired with other systems, making them ideal for creating a system to fit each site's unique needs.

Q. Is your company expanding any of its operations or locations?

A.ABUTEC is expanding our regional service reach by opening service hubs throughout the U.S., the next of which will be located in Greeley, Colorado. This service hub will strengthen service capability in northeast Colorado and provide excellent customer service to multiple existing clients in Colorado and Wyoming. The service hub will be used to coordinate safety meetings and fulfill unit and service needs. The hub is



equipped with a yard large enough to house ABUTEC products, including the ABUTEC 20,ABUTEC 100 and ABUTEC 200, in addition to the new High Pressure/Low Pressure integrated solution.

The proximity of the new service hub to existing ABUTEC customers will provide even faster delivery of products and parts and will allow service technicians to quickly attend to equipment and service needs.

Q. Is the company changing any of its services or products? A. With the number of multi-pad wells on the rise, ABUTEC has created a High Pressure/Low Pressure (HP/LP) Integrated Solution that serves as ABUTEC's most versatile product.

The HP/LP system is ideal for facilities that require dual flow applications, since the package is able to handle high-flow, low-flow and variable-flow applications. ABUTEC has combined the power of the HP 1500 with the safety and reliability of the ABUTEC 20, 100 or 200 to create a system that can be used as a complete unit or as independent units. Another feature of the HP/LP system is its capability to handle a wide range of flow rates – everything from 5 MSCFD to 200 MSCFD.

In addition to its ideal use for dual flow applications, the HP/LP Integrated Solution has been used by ABUTEC customers for backup flaring when their plant was offline for maintenance or experiencing downtime. ABUTEC's HP/LP solution is also EPA compliant and Quad O approved.

Q. What is your company's main strength or its edge over the competition?

A.ABUTEC offers the flexibility of a small company, with the resources of a large corporation. Because we customize units based on individual sites and customer needs, ABUTEC is able to offer the products and services that our partners require.

Q. What new markets, clients or projects did your company attract in the last year?

Q. What is the official name of your company?

A. Lister Industries Ltd.A second generation family owned operation with the 3rd just around the corner.

Q. Is your firm a subsidiary or affiliate of other companies? If so, please name those firms and their relationship to your company.

A. We have many relationships with rental companies in North America and pride ourselves in referring people to them for location based enquiries. This works as a win, win for everyone as we strictly manufacture and don't compete with them, yet are able to satisfy the end user with an affordable delivery and usage for short term projects where buying doesn't make sense.

Q.What do you most want people to know about your company?

A. Family owned & operated since 1973. Customer service is paramount. We listen to our customers' needs and adjust accordingly which means customizing mats, line crossings, ramps or whatever they require. We have the only engineered mats in the industry which are the strongest and longest lasting rig mats in the industry.

Q.Where is your company located?

A. Edmonton Alberta, we have two manufacturing facilities.

Q. What year was the company founded and by whom?

A. Lister Oilfield Welding Ltd. was established by Harold Lister in 1953. He started by designing and manufacturing his own boilers & air heaters in Edmonton at the main plant where we are still based today. When oil exploration in the remote north created unique needs, Harold met the demand with his new line up of specialized cold weather products, including rig mats.

Harold sold his business in April 1978, to Don & Mary Rowland. Over the years Lister has introduced new specialty products while continuing to refine the reliable Lister rig mats.

Q.What is your company's primary business activity?

A. Manufacturer of rig mats, line crossings and custom steel fabrication. The average life of a Lister Rig Mat is 10 years, but many have continued

to be active for 15-20 years. Our rig mats consist of two continuous wood sections with laminations glued and nailed together for superior rigidity. The glue between the wooden planks reduces liquid absorption and hence eliminates weight gain in the field. Strength is mainly provided by the steel beams, and the wood sections assisted by lateral flat bars transfer part of the load from one beam to another.

Lister Interlocking Road Mats, the new entry in the earth friendly area of ground protection, allowing transportation of

machinery and materials into remote areas on these mats without any permanent damage. The mats are constructed from structural steel and glue laminated wood packets. The hook and eye assembly allows for multiple mat pads which are expandable in any direction. This construction method results in a superior product delivering longer mat life and a more durable surface.

Q. Are there important projects the company is currently a part of or has done recently?

A. Lister has recently completed engineering, design and installation of an all steel rig mat in virtually any size, for the new Safety and stability being the key issues, these mats have put an end to crushed wood mats especially the cross beam and cross laminated style mats where there is no connectivity. Those mats simply cannot hold the load transfers of 4 relatively small stomper pads which carry the entire weight of the rig in a small footprint. These new field tested steel mats allow these behemoths to move on the pad in any direction without compromising stress load & deflection. We have been working closely with Chevron in the U.S. along with their contractors and are having great success.

Q. How many employees does your company have? A. We employ 50 full time welders, laborers and office personnel, with many of them being long term.

Q. Describe the equipment your company uses and are there any new equipment purchases planned?

A.We have custom fabricated assembly lines for both lumber and steel components. We are continuously striving to manufacture and provide the best rig and road mats, line crossings and ramps to meet the needs of our clients.

Q. Is your company expanding any of its operations or locations?

A. We expanded, opening an additional facility just down the street from our main plant and office 9 years ago to keep up with the growing demand. We have also learned over the years to try not to tackle too much and to be satisfied taking care of fewer people correctly instead of too many too fast and making costly mistakes by over committing. Grow slow and steady and you will survive & thrive!

Q. Is the company changing any of its services or products? A. We strive to continuously monitor components to adapt to the ever changing drilling field adjusting materials and design wherever necessary.

Q. What is your company's main strength or its edge over the competition?

A. Personal service, common sense approach and backing up what we say we will do. With our many years of experience in rig mat design and manufacturing, we are committed to excellence in continuing to meet the challenges of the oil and gas drilling and service industry. After studying the ups and downs of this industry and having the ability to track it by sales over the past 61 years, we know that you must tend to the small companies as well as the large ones as word of mouth is your best marketing tool. We have good market share with many long



time loyal customers around the world and plan on maintaining that reputation for our children to carry on the tradition.

Q. What is the most challenging work/contract the company has undertaken?

A. It is and always has been fulfilling large orders overseas under extreme time limits where transportation issues are out of our hands.

Q. What are the biggest obstacles to completing work your company undertakes?

A. Material supply in a timely fashion and the ability attract & retain qualified employees.

Q. What do you see as your company's biggest challenge in the next five years?

A. The price of oil is always the main factor. Over the past 61 years we have seen extreme lows and wonderful pinnacles of growth & success. We don't expect that to change.

Q. Does your company have an anniversary or other landmark event coming up?

A. No but we celebrate with company parties and picnics often to keep morale at a great pace.

Q.What is the average length of time employee's work for the company?

A. Employee longevity average is 5 to 10 years with many at the 15 year mark.

A. We have a good safety record and have implemented the COR program & policies as the main contractors in the industry recognize this program to be top notch and it keeps us on track.




Q.What is the name of your company? A. M SPACE

Q. Does your company operate using any other names? A. Our residential division is called M SPACE Housing.

Q. When did you first start doing business in the Bakken Region?

A. We first started working in the Bakken in 2012. Our first project was additional classroom space for the Williston School District. We provided them with 34,000 square feet of classroom and restroom space at two different locations. We then expanded to residential construction, building seven housing developments within a year.



A. M SPACE was founded in 2001 and grew quickly from a small modular leasing company to a large, fully integrated general contractor by building relationships with valued clients, dedicated employees and trusted subcontractors. We have created proven technologies, systems and processes to provide comprehensive building solutions.

We have offices located throughout the Unites States and offer a diverse range of building types. Projects range from small temporary buildings to large multi-story, permanent complexes. We work with a variety of industries including education, healthcare and government as well as commercial and residential housing.

We initially provided temporary/relocatable buildings, which offer speed and flexibility and quickly branched out to include



permanent modular construction, an alternative to traditional construction methods, which utilizes a significantly streamlined construction process. We have also completed projects that combine modular and traditional construction, the most recent being a two story 65,000 square foot state of the art high school which consisted of 24 classrooms, a presentation hall, common areas, administrative offices, a full service kitchen, restrooms and a nurse's office.

Q. What is your company's primary business activity in the Bakken region?

A. Our primary business in the Bakken is our six housing developments that currently have homes available for rent; Ridgeview, Ponderosa, Hillview, Countryview, Dakota Ridge and Bison Run. The de-

velopments meet a variety of housing needs including workforce/efficiency, single family and corporate/employee housing.

Q.What are your goals as a housing provider in the Bakken? A. Our main goal is to bring quality housing options to the region. Our homes offer convenient locations, superior amenities and pricing relative to the market. We have studio, 1, 2 and 3 bedroom homes. Whether someone is looking for single occupancy, corporate shared housing or family living, we have an option to meet their needs.

Our homes are equipped with everything from furniture to housewares and linens. We also provide HDTV's with cable or satellite TV.

Q. Where are your housing developments located?

A. Ridgeview - Fairview/Dore, ND, studio and 1 bedroom/1 bathroom; Ponderosa -Alexander, ND, studio and 1 bedroom/1 bathroom & 2 bedroom/2 bathroom; Hillview - Alexander, ND, 3 bedroom/ 2 bathroom; Countryview - Watford City, ND, 3 bed-



room/2 bathroom; Dakota Ridge - Watford City, ND, 3 bedroom/2 bathroom; Bison Run - Watford City, ND, 3 bedroom/3.5 bathroom.

Q. Are there important projects the company is currently a part of or has done recently?

A. Our newest development, Bison Run, is underway in Watford City. It's a community of well designed, 3 bedroom and 3.5 bathroom twin homes that are located a short distance from restaurants, grocery and retail stores. The homes at Bison Run are available furnished or unfurnished, come with washer and dryers and have large 2-truck garages. This development also offers wide paved roads and a club house that is coming soon. We have tenants currently living in the completed homes and are preleasing the homes that are under construction. Phase one is scheduled for completion at the end of this year.

Q. We understand that you also have a commercial park in Alexander. What can you tell us about it?

A. We are currently providing commercial and light industrial buildings at the Alexander Energy Park. This 120 acre property sits at the intersection of Highway 85 and 68, halfway between Williston and Watford City. The energy park offers prime highway exposure with lots for sale as well as build-to-suit sale and lease options. The Alexander Energy Park consists of mixed use industrial buildings that include, but aren't limited to, commercial condominiums, warehouse space with drive through bays, retail and storefront options and administrative office space. The energy park will also soon be the home to a travel plaza offering tenants a convenient place to get food, fuel and other essentials. Another unique feature of the Alexander Energy Park is the close proximity to our Hillview property, offering companies the opportunity to house employees nearby. Companies located within the Alexander Energy Park include Wanzek, a subsidiary of MasTec, JW Power and XTO a subsidiary of Exxon Mobile.





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

Vertex Rail Technologies plans to produce rail cars



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
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
