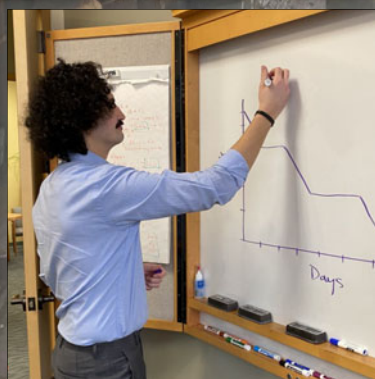
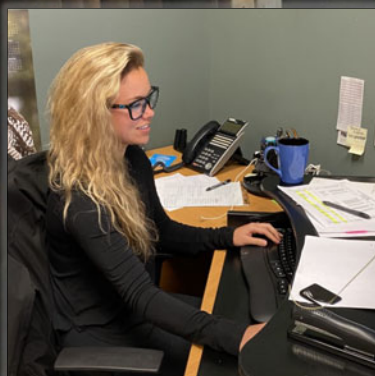

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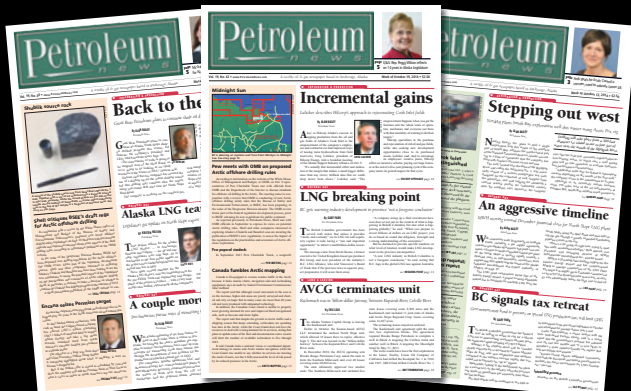

Ahtna celebrates 50 years investing in Alaska's future generations

Company continues to thrive with focus on wise stewardship of lands and responsible economic growth

Q. What is the official name of your company?

A. Ahtna, Incorporated

Q. Is your firm a subsidiary or affiliate of other companies? If so, please name those firms and their relationship to your company.

A. Ahtna, Inc. is one of the Alaska Native regional corporations established by Congress under terms of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971. Ahtna's business holding company, Ahtna Netiyé', LLC, provides strategic direction and corporate structure stability for the Ahtna family of companies that is aimed at long-

term growth and success. Netiyé' is an Ahtna Athabascan word meaning "our strength."

Q. What do you most want people to know about your company?

A. We have a strong and vested interest in ongoing oil and gas production in the state. Ahtna laid the first section of pipe on the Trans Alaska Pipeline System which passes through 197 miles of Ahtna's traditional lands and 55 miles of our fee simple lands.



Q. Where is your company located?

A. Ahtna's Corporate Headquarters is based in Glennallen, Alaska. We have project locations across the country and other main offices are located in Anchorage, Palmer and Fairbanks, AK; West Sacramento, Irvine, Oakland and Monterey, CA; San Antonio, TX; Pompano Beach, FL; and Renton, WA. Our operations in Alaska stretch all the way from the far reaches of the Aleutian chain up to the North Slope and numerous areas in between. We operate as effectively in highly remote locations as we do in dense urban landscapes.

Q. What year was the company founded and by whom?

A. Ahtna, Inc. was formally established in June of 1972. We are proud to celebrate 50 years of doing business this year. We are owned by more than 2,100 shareholders, the majority of whom are of Ahtna Athabascan descent. Today, people who are traditionally hunters and fishermen own a family of exceptional companies that design and implement complex projects, build extraordinary facilities, and provide services for many of our local, state, and federal agencies.

Q. What is your company's primary business activity?

A. Our multi-disciplinary staff of professionals provides civil

and vertical construction, construction management, aggregate production, geomatics, environmental services, engineering, operations and maintenance, spill response and prevention, facilities management, logistics and security support to the oil and gas industry.

Q. Are there important projects the company is currently a part of or has done recently?

A. We acquired 23 acres of North Slope pad space situated within the Prudhoe Bay Unit which is available for leasing. The pad footprint is strategically located on Spline Road, just south of Flow Station 3, and less than five miles from the Deadhorse airport. The pad includes 15 acres of gravel and ideal space for a laydown yard or equipment, rig, or camp storage.

Q. How many employees does your company have?

A. We have over 1,100 employees worldwide with over 300 based in Alaska.

Q. Describe the equipment your company uses and are there any new equipment purchases planned?

A. We own specialized equipment that's geared towards environmentally-friendly work. We are one of the few companies

that owns a morooka (a dump truck on tracks).

Q. Is your company expanding any of its operations or locations?

A. We have purchased an office in Monterey, CA where we have successfully operated for over 20 years and opened a regional hub office in the Renton area of Seattle, WA. Our Fairbanks environmental services staff has moved to a larger office and our Anchorage-based staff has increased. The purchase of a storage warehouse in midtown Anchorage has allowed us to securely store our subsidiaries' equipment in a centralized location. AAA Valley Gravel, our full-service construction and aggregate production subsidiary, has expanded our offerings in the Mat-Su area with their 100-acre property.

Q. Is the company changing any of its services or products?

A. We have partnered with large aerial-related companies to grow our geomatics services and provide our clients with all the tools and resources to collect, integrate, and manage the geospatial information needed to support the most complex projects. Our custom LiDAR (light detection and ranging) processing software delivers unmatched performance and can run on multiple platforms.

Q. What is your company's main strength or its edge over the competition?

A. We are a modern corporation guided by traditional values – values that define our corporation and the way we do business. Thousands of years ago, the Ahtna Athabaskan people built a home in a harsh Alaska environment. For generations, they survived and thrived through teamwork, hard work, community, loyalty and integrity. Respect – We appreciate our connectedness to all; Unity – We are One Team, One Ahtna; Safety – Safety first, the right way, everyday; Quality – We exceed expectations through excellence; Integrity – We do the right thing.

Q. What new markets, clients or projects did your company attract in the last year?

A. We continue to form new companies and our increased bonding capacity of \$100 million for a single project and \$500 million aggregate has allowed our subsidiaries to pursue larger government and commercial contracts.

Several subsidiaries have established new program partnerships through the Small Business Administration (SBA) mentor-protégé program. Merrick & Company of Denver supports our development of geospatial expertise for the energy market sector. Our joint venture with Great Lakes Environmental & Infrastructure is pursuing work with the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). Our relationship with M.A. Mortenson Company, a Minneapolis-based construction company, has expanded our services in the Midwest. We now have four joint ventures with CDM Smith, a global engineering and construction firm. Together with J.F. Brennan Company, we have executed new environmental dredging and dam construction projects.

Q. What is the most challenging work/contract the company has undertaken?

A. The work our employees are performing on the 2,600-foot-high slopes of Thompson Pass near Valdez is exhilarating to witness. Ahtna crews continue to take on the most challenging projects along the pipeline.

Q. What is your company's safety record? What steps does the company take to ensure a safe work environment?

A. Ahtna is committed to a safe and productive work environment. Our occupational illness and injury rates are well below the current national average despite extreme inclement weather and re-

mote operations. Currently, our experience modification rate (EMR) of 0.70 is well below the construction industry national average. Our site health and safety plans ensure hazards are identified and mitigated, specific site-safety reviews are continuously conducted, and daily safety and work plans are held.

Q. How does our company support its shareholders?

A. As an Alaska Native corporation, we are not focused solely on profitability, but also the provision of vital shareholder services and programs aimed at preserving our cultural identity, developing our resources, protecting our land and enhancing the lives of our people. Ahtna, Inc. has delivered over \$107 million in shareholder benefits in the last five years. We support our people by way of dividends and other benefits such as scholarships, training, and employment. In 2021, we provided over \$1 million to support non-profits in the Ahtna region that address quality of life issues, culture, environmental stewardship, safety, and education.

Lynden supports 50th anniversary Iditarod race

As reported by Lynden News Feb. 18, the Iditarod sled dog race celebrates its 50th anniversary this year, and Lynden will be out in front as a major sponsor of the 2022 race. The world-famous Iditarod begins March 5 in Nome, Alaska, and commemorates the mushers and dog teams that delivered life-saving diphtheria serum to save critically ill children in 1925.

“Lynden has a long history of supporting the Iditarod and the mushers and dog teams who compete each year,” says Susie Stevens, Lynden Transport account manager and coordinator of Lynden’s involvement in the event. “We are proud to support this iconic Alaskan race on its 50th anniversary and to celebrate the culture and heritage it represents.”

ChampionX announces next generation pump system

As reported on championx.com Jan. 27, ChampionX Corp. announced that UNBRIDLED ESP Systems has introduced the HIGH RISE series pump line, which is engineered to significantly improve electrical submersible pumping system performance and longevity while also meaningfully reducing the carbon footprint of ESP operations.

HIGH RISE pumps feature patented Oculus technology, which allows the pumps to achieve up to 33% greater lift per unit length of pump. Higher lift per stage means fewer components in the well and faster installs to minimize rig time while also reducing the overall carbon footprint of an ESP system. The HIGH RISE pump series also covers an extended production range from 200 to 7,500 barrels per day.

“The Oculus technology feature in our HIGH RISE pumps allow operators to achieve their production targets with significantly less iron in the well, which helps reduce the carbon footprint of an ESP installation. Based on internal calculations of our manufacturing processes and EPA data, HIGH RISE pumps reduce carbon emissions by one ton per install and use on average 20% less heavy metals,” said Ryan Rasmussen, vice president and managing director of ChampionX’s UNBRIDLED ESP Systems.

ESPs are designed to handle the high initial production rates common in unconventional wells and to achieve the necessary pressure draw down to maximize reserve recovery. However, the continuously changing operating conditions - like rapidly declining production rates and gas slugs in the fluid stream - that are typical in unconventional plays have a heavy impact on ESP performance. The HIGH RISE series pumps are designed to address those issues and to assure consistent quality.

Calista Corp. allocates remaining CARES Act funds

As reported on calistacorp.com Jan. 18, Calista Corp. has coordinated the remaining CARES Act tribal relief funds to provide meaningful impact to shareholders in the YK Region - through food security, ice roads - and to those experiencing homelessness.

In August 2021, Calista received \$12.2 million in CARES Act funding, about 2% of the funds were set aside for Alaska Native corporations, and they had to dedicate the use of these funds by the end of December 2021. The board directed up to \$11.4 million - or 93% - to be available for direct financial assistance to shareholders. The board also directed \$10,000 to purchase fish for distribution to lower Yukon River communities experiencing a salmon disaster.

Each shareholder who applied and qualified for Calista CARES Act financial assistance by the Nov. 30 deadline received a \$325 distribution. Nearly 80% of shareholders applied and qualified by the deadline.

The board directed Calista staff to determine an appropriate way to spend any CARES Act funds remaining after the financial assistance program ended, meeting strict U.S. Treasury requirements for the use of these funds. As a result, this winter, Calista entered into agreements with nonprofits for the following projects: \$17,000 for holiday food distribution for residents in Bethel and surrounding villages via Bethel Community Services Foundation; \$1.6 million for extensive food security program via BCSF; \$185,000 for Kuskokwim ice road via the Native Village of Napaimute; \$500,000 to support purchase of the Sockeye Inn in Anchorage to help those experiencing homelessness, via the Rasmuson Foundation.

"Our mission has always been to provide Shareholders with benefits and opportunities. CARES funding has allowed us to provide some additional support to our Shareholders during this ongoing pandemic," said Andrew Guy, Calista Corp. president/CEO.

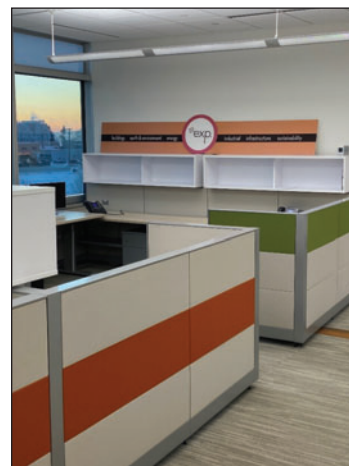

The Aréna Chénier achieves LEED certification

As reported by EXP news Jan. 6, the Aréna Chénier receives LEED certification, Certified from the Canada Green Building Council. EXP's mechanical, electrical, structural and civil engineering



teams collaborated on the project, which sought to bring the building to standards and replace the refrigeration system of its indoor ice rink. This work is part of the Montreal protocol on substances that deplete the ozone layer, an international environmental agreement that regulates production and consumption and aims to phase out many chemicals, known as ozone depleting substances.

The project proposed the replacement of the ice rink's refrigeration system, which used Freon, an OSD, by one using ammonia. Besides the refrigeration system, EXP performed the redesign of the changing room area, the set-up of a room to install the new refrigeration system, as well as the installation of a system that reuses the heat produced by the refrigeration system to heat the building and its water supply. It also includes the design of a high-performance dehumidification system around the ice rink, an intelligent lighting system and a holding system that allows a reduced flow of water being discharged in the municipal installations during heavy rains. EXP's multidisciplinary teams designed and provided innovative and sustainable solutions to reduce the building's energy consumption and its environmental footprint, which led to LEED certification.

Coffman Anchorage engineer earns professional licenses

Alaska Marine Lines wraps up strong fish season

As reported by Lynden News Nov. 8, "We had a very good seafood year," says Tyler Maurer, Alaska Marine Lines seafood sales manager. The 2021 fish season for Alaska Marine Lines and

the supporting Lynden companies has been strong. Alaska salmon runs were 15% higher than projected, and the Bristol Bay sockeye salmon run stunned scientists with a record 66.1 million fish, with a catch of approximately 40 million which was 90% of the record 44 million.

At Lynden, salmon season is an “all hands on deck” event typically lasting from May through September. All Lynden companies were busy keeping up with the volume this year, prompted not only by larger returns, but by restaurants opening back up after pandemic closures and a change in consumer buying habits.

Each year, Lynden Air Cargo flies fresh fish from Naknek, Emmonak, Cold Bay, Sand Point and Dillingham to Anchorage where Lynden Logistics provides support for transloading to Alaska Marine Lines, Alaska West Express and Lynden Transport and ships seafood with other air carriers all over the world. LTI Inc. trucks provide Seattle surface delivery support and provide transportation to locations in the Lower 48.

On average, Alaska Marine Lines moves 7,000 containers of fish each year from Alaska fisheries southbound to Seattle. “We moved over 11,000 containers this year,” Tyler explains, “and we still have more frozen and canned product to clean out of Alaska for a few more weeks to come.”

To prepare for the push each year, Lynden asks its customers for projections so it can build realistic expectations for staffing and equipment. “We knew this would be a big year,” Tyler says. “We just didn’t expect it would be this big of a year with all regions having strong returns.” For more information visit info.lynden.com/blog.

In an Oct. 29 interview with Stu Varney on Fox Business Network, U.S. Sen. Dan Sullivan, R-Alaska, praised Alaska Railroad Corp. for rescinding its initial vaccine mandate for its employees pending the outcome of legal challenges to President Biden’s order.

Sullivan urged employers across the country not to fire their employees who are out of compliance with the Biden administration’s COVID-19 vaccine mandates, which Sullivan contends are unconstitutional.

“We all want to put the COVID-19 pandemic behind us, and I’ve encouraged everyone to get vaccinated, in consultation with their doctor. But the president of the United States does not have the constitutional or statutory authority to mandate vaccinations,” said Sullivan.

“In 2020, a key principle that congressional Democrats and Republicans and the Trump administration committed to was ensuring businesses that receive pandemic relief retain their workers. Joe Biden is now taking a sledgehammer to that connection, telling American businesses to fire employees who do not comply,” he said.

“Forcing employers to fire thousands of Americans right before the holidays is wrong and unthinkable. I’m glad to see a movement of employers, like the Alaska Railroad Corporation, standing up and rejecting these mandates, and I’ll continue to encourage others to stand by their hard-working employees,” Sullivan said.
