Q.What is the official name of your company? A. Bald Mountain Air Service Inc.

Q.What do you most want people to know about your company?

A.That we are an Alaska Native-owned business and that we specialize in custom aviation solutions.

Q.Where is your company located?

A. We have locations in Anchorage, Homer and Deadhorse, Alaska.

Q.What year was the company founded and by whom? A. In 1993, by Gary and Jeanne Porter of Homer.

Q.What is your company's primary business activity? A.Air carrier, single and multi-engine charters

Q.Are there important projects the company is currently a



part of or has done recently?

A. Alaska wildland fire support, oil and gas exploration support in the North Slope and Cook Inlet.

Q. How many employees does your company have?

A. We have a staff of 20 employees.

Q. Describe the equipment your company uses and are there any new equipment purchases planned?

A. We operate single and twin engine DeHavilland Otters, a King Air B200 and a King Air 350. We are planning to purchase two CASA CN 235-10 airplanes within the next year.

Q. Is your company expanding any of its operations or locations?

A. In 2014, we will be adding CASA CN 235 combi flights from Anchorage to Deadhorse. These new aircraft will give us *Continued on next page*

the capability to carry 18 passengers with palletized cargo, oversized loads, bulk fuel delivery and wild land fire fighting smoke jumper/para cargo operations in Alaska, Canada and the Lower **48**.

Q. Is the company changing any of its services or products? A.We will be providing medium lift, oversized cargo and passenger combination services using the CASA CN 235. These planes allow for 18 passenger, along with palletized cargo flights from Anchorage - statewide.

Q.What is your company's main strength or its edge over the competition?

A. We specialize in remote, short field, off airport support for natural resource exploration. We are an Alaska-owned company with a perfect safety record.

Q.What new markets, clients or projects did your company attract in the last year?

A. Oil and gas exploration, mining and wild land fire fighting support.

Q.What is the most challenging work/contract the company has undertaken?

A.We supported the FEX Oil and Gas drilling program in NPR-A with 2 Twin Otters and 2 Single Otters. This project was located 160 miles west of Prudhoe Bay. We operated in all types of weather, handling cargo and freight movement, while building an 8,000-square-foot hangar and living quarters at the same time.

Q.What are the biggest obstacles to completing work your company undertakes?

A. The Federal Aviation Administration needs for more resources so that it can certify additional aircraft for our client's requirements.

Q.What do you see as your company's biggest challenge in the next five years?

A. Being able to add additional aircraft to meet the needs of our clients.

Q. Does your company have an anniversary or other landmark event coming up?

A. This is our 20th year in business without any accidents or incidents.

Q.What is the average length of time employees work for the company?

A. We have employees that have been with the company for 20 years.

A. Crowley Solutions, Inc.


Q. Is your firm a subsidiary or affiliate of other companies? If so, please name those firms and their relationship to your company.

A. Crowley Solutions, Inc. is wholly owned by Crowley Maritime Corporation, which owns a variety of subsidiaries, including TITAN Salvage, Jensen Maritime Consultants, Customized Brokers, Crowley Petroleum Distribution, Crowley Marine Services, Inc.

Crowley Solutions is also a partner in several joint ventures, including UIC Bowhead-Crowley, LLC.

Q.What do you most want people to know about your company?

A.We are a project management organization offering marine engineering, procurement, construction and management services in addition to extensive marine transport expertise. Crowley operates worldwide and has been operating continuously in the Arctic for more than 50 years. We leverage this experience



Q.Where is your company located? A. In Alaska, Crowley Solutions has offices in Anchorage and Prudhoe Bay, with additional

offices in Houston, New Orleans, Seattle, Sakhalin Island and a new office opening in Singapore. Crowley Petroleum Distribution has 24 offices in Alaska and Crowley Ship Assist and Escort Services has an office in Valdez.

Q.What year was the company founded and by whom? A. Our company was founded in 1892, when founder Thomas Crowley — the grandfather of current chairman, president and CEO Thomas B. Crowley Jr. — purchased an 18-foot Whitehall boat to provide transportation of personnel and supplies to ships anchored on San Francisco Bay. The present structure, in which Crowley Maritime Corporation serves as a holding company for business lines and all subsidiaries, was put in place in 1992. The company is wholly and privately owned by the Crowley family and Crowley employees. Crowley Solutions was

formed in 2012.

Q.What is your company's primary business activity? A. Crowley Solutions is a project management organization providing comprehensive marine services for energy and resource extraction industries. We offer a wide array of turnkey solutions to our clients, including project management, marine operations, naval architecture and marine salvage. Working with Crowley gives our customers the advantage of a single point of contact and ensures coordination among all of the company's services. Our service offerings include: project management, fuel management, engineering, vessel design and build, emergency response, ocean towing, heavy lift barge transportation, and project concept studies.

Q.Are there important projects the company is currently a part of or has done recently?

A. We are currently providing fuel management services for the tank farm facility at Pt. Thomson. We have recently completed sealifts for both ENI and BP, which involved transporting large modules by barge from the U.S. Gulf to the U.S. Arctic. We have also transported a series of state-of-the-art drill rigs for BP, Parker and Doyon from the U.S. West Coast to the Arctic. The most recent rig move involved lightering the rig components offshore due to the draft restrictions at the dock. In 2012 we completed a large module transportation project in Sakhalin Island, Russia. Ongoing operations include coastal barging services, spill response barge services, rig towing and hovercraft operations.

Q. How many employees does your company have?

A. Crowley's domestic workforce is more than 3,500 today, with 625 employees in Alaska.

Q. Describe the equipment your company uses and are there any new equipment purchases planned?

A. Crowley Solutions operates a wide variety of tug and barge equipment. Our newest addition to the fleet is our Ocean Class vessels with 150 Tons of Bollard pull designed specifically for rig towing services. We operate the largest domestic fleet of heavylift barge equipment. These barges can transport up to 20,000 tons of cargo on a single barge. In the Arctic, we have a fleet of shallow draft tugs and barges that have been specifically designed to operate in the shallow waters of off-shore Alaska. We also operate unique equipment, such as our Arctic Hawk hovercraft on the North Slope, where its unique capabilities allow operations during periods of broken ice off-shore.

Q. Is your company expanding any of its operations or locations?

A. We are currently planning an expansion into the Asian-Pacific theatre, as well as opening a Crowley Solutions office in Singapore this year. In addition, we are designing and building a variety of equipment specifically designed for this market.

Q. Is the company changing any of its services or products?

A. Crowley Solutions is focused on the full range of project management services to support development projects. Crowley has built new equipment to better support the requirements for larger modules and drilling rigs associated with the North Slope of Alaska and deepwater projects in the Gulf of Mexico. We are also working with companies who are leading exploration projects on the Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) in the Arctic in support of their efforts. The development of the OCS could be a major driver of new equipment and services as well as future production infrastructure in the Arctic. *Q.What is your company's main strength or its edge over the competition?*

A. Crowley is set apart by our extensive Arctic experience, robust HSSE systems and management framework, comprehensive project management, inhouse design and engineering support, access to the right equipment for the project, and above all, our employees.

Q.What is the most challenging work/contract the company has under taken?

A. Crowley most recently participated in the support operations for the Kulluk. Crowley responded to the request for assistance with rescue tugs and other support services. When the Kulluk was recovered, Crowley provided the primary towing tug for the transportation of the Kulluk from Kodiak to Dutch Harbor and supported the loading operation of the heavy lift ship.

Crowley's subsidiary, TITAN Salvage, is currently contracted for the salvage of the Costa Concordia off the coast of Italy.

Q.What are the biggest obstacles to completing work your company under-takes?

A. The environmental challenges of working in the Arctic, the remote nature of our projects, challenging conditions, and coordinating the logistics of having the right people and equipment in a specific place at a specific time are some of the challenges Crowley successfully overcomes on a daily basis.

Q. Does your company have an anniversary or other landmark event coming up?

A. 2013 is Crowley's 60th year of operating in Alaska.

Q.What is the average length of time employee's work for the company?

A. The average length of employment is 9.34 years, however, 17 percent of our domestic workforce has worked for the company more than 20 years.

Q.What is your company's safety record? What steps does the company take to ensure a safe work environment?

A. Our core values; safety management system, including internal management and continuous improvement; and our intensive training program are key to Crowley's impressive safety record.

Q. Has your company been involved in any community

Global assets backed by local expertise yields decades of success in Alaska

Q.What is your company's primary business activity? A: Fugro collects and interprets data related to the earth's surface and subsurface. We offer a full range of onshore and offshore survey and geotechnical services, as well as subsea sup-

port, for projects related to oil and gas, mining, building and infrastructure, and sustainable energy.

Q.What do you most want people to know about Fugro?

A: Fugro is a global company with a long and proven history in Alaska. Our experience in the state dates back to the 1970s when we supported oil and gas exploration activities in the Bering, Beaufort and Chukchi Seas. Some of the people who worked on these early programs are in-

volved in our Arctic projects today. It's an impressive legacy and we benefit greatly from the involvement of these longtime Fugro employees.

Q.What are some of the projects Fugro has undertaken in

Alaska this year?

A. In the offshore arena, we managed multiple survey projects for oil and gas clients in the Chukchi Sea and Cook Inlet. Services included positioning, pipeline inspection, ice gouge, and shallow hazards surveys. In April, we performed a remotesensing ice thickness mapping program in the Chukchi Sea. We also completed a hydrographic charting project for NOAA in

the Aleutians. Onshore, we performed airborne geophysical surveys for the state of Alaska to help identify new mining prospects, and performed topographic mapping services related to



the Statewide Digital Mapping Initiative (SDMI). We also provided geotechnical consulting services to an engineering firm in support of a major hydroelectric power project.

Q. Describe the equipment your company uses. A. Fugro owns a large inventory of specialized and built-forpurpose equipment. Globally, these resources include vessels, aircraft, drill rigs, jack-up platforms, laboratories, and a host of related sensors and systems. These global resources are a great complement to our local assets, which primarily comprise offshore geophysical equipment, and can be mobilized for work on Alaska projects as needed.At times, specifically for vessels and helicopters, third-party charters are a better choice for our local clients. In these cases, we have longstanding relationships with equipment providers.

Q.What are your company's main strengths?

A.We are locally based but have the strategic and financial backing of a global company, which allows us to take the long-view when it comes to working in Alaska. This is a difficult place to sustain a capital-intensive business like ours. Anyone who has lived in Alaska knows how quickly a major project can come to a halt due to regulatory hurdles. When that happens, we are able to "wait it out", mobilizing crew and equipment to work on Fugro projects in other parts of the world until the Alaska work comes back online. This flexibility is key to our maintaining a highly skilled local staff despite sometimes unpredictable market pressures.



part of the SDMI. It was during this project that Fugro discovered the ability for GeoSAR to penetrate snow and ice, a finding that could lead to a number of important Arctic applications including sea-ice thickness mapping. Over the past two



Commitment to innovation is another strength. As an organization, Fugro has long worked with system manufacturers, clients, and universities to develop and test new technologies and/or to develop new applications for existing technologies. The GeoSAR system is a perfect example. A dual-band airborne radar mapping system, GeoSAR was developed by NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory and commercialized by Fugro as a way to provide efficient, large-area mapping in regions obscured by vegetation or clouds. In 2010, GeoSAR was used in Alaska as er the past two years, we have engaged in several studies to test this capability, partnering with the University of Alaska Fairbanks and major oil and gas companies with interests in Alaska.

Q.What new markets, clients or projects did your company attract in the last year?

A. One of the most exciting developments is the ice-thickness mapping capability I just mentioned. Based on promising results from two years of tests, 2013 will mark our first fully-funded program, though the project will be taking place in Arctic regions outside Alaska. While the capability is continuing to be developed, it is believed that GeoSAR will help reduce uncertainty in the prediction of ice-loads and provide accurate, timely information about sea-ice thickness, structure, extent, ridges, and modeling. *Q.What are the biggest challenges to completing the projects your company undertakes?*

A. Working in Alaska means working in extremes. Even the most straightforward project typically entails logistical challenges due to remote locations, as well as technical challenges due to Alaska's harsh environment. But

if it was easy, it wouldn't be so rewarding. We have great teams of people tackling these projects. They are



skilled in their field and trained in Alaska's field conditions. Being prepared is something Fugro takes seriously, which is evident through our ISO-certified quality management, occupational health and safety, and environmental management systems, as well as our stellar safety record.

Q.What do you see as the biggest obstacles to your company's success in the next five years?

A. Political uncertainty. While Fugro is firmly committed to Alaska and the Arctic in a broader sense, I think we, and other companies like us, would be so much stronger if our clients were working in a more stable regulatory environment.

Q.What is the official name of your company? A. Polyguard Products, Inc.

Q.What do you most want people to know about your company?

A. Polyguard has made pipeline corrosion coatings since 1950. We are a 100 percent employee owned company, and most products we sell are products which we invented rather than copied from competitor's products.

Q.Where is your company located? A. Ennis, TX.

Q.What year was the company founded and by whom? A. In 1950 by Robert M. Nee and Frank McNulty.

Q.What is your company's primary business activity?

A. Manufacture of corrosion coatings and waterproofing. Polyguard's Pipeline Division has been active in the pipeline protective coating industry for more than 50 years. This division has designed,

manufactured, and introduced a number of innovative underground pipeline coatings and girth weld coatings, which have become commercially accepted as standards for the industry. They are both non-shielding coatings and soil stress tolerant.

Q.Are there important projects the company is currently a part of or has done recently?

A. Lots of them however, many oil companies don't like to have their name publicized, and we can't list them. We are in the process helping one oil company stop corrosion on many,



many miles of pipe in Northern Alaska. We solved a major corrosion problem downhole in thousands of oil wells saving several oil companies MANY millions of dollars; that's the type of innovative products we are capable of bringing to market to solve problems.

Q. How many employees does your company have? A.We currently have around 90 employees.

Q. Describe the equipment your company uses and is there any new equipment purchases planned?

A.We are in our 21st successive year of sales growth, so we are always expanding, updating, and improving our manufacturing and laboratory capabilities.

Q. Is your company expanding any of its operations or locations?

A. In the last 3 years we have added 1 million gallons of raw material storage.

Q. Is the company changing any of its services or products? A. Not so much changing as introducing new, such as the two part epoxy we introduced in 2012, several insulation vapor proofing, weatherproofing, and cladding products for commercial and industrial insulation. Our Architectural division is growing in a very difficult time for the construction industry; this is due again to innovative new products.

Q.What is your company's main strength or its edge over the competition?

A. Innovation – we have always had more technical people than sales people. Our original product line, corrosion coatings for steel pipelines, remains strong and growing today. In 1970 Polyguard introduced architectural waterproofing membranes. In 2002 Polyguard introduced RG-2400[®] anti-corrosion gel, an innovative patented technology which successfully solves the problem of corrosion under insulation. In 2003 Polyguard launched the Underseal[™] system to offer protection against termites, pests, radon gas, moisture, insecticides/pesticides as well as provide waterproofing and crack reduction in concrete structures.



Polyguard's highway waterproofing membranes, introduced in the early 1970's, have been specified by most major DOT's for use on pavement and bridges.

With our ISO 9001 certification, Polyguard is committed to maintaining a high level of quality in both product manufacture and product development.

Q.What new markets, clients or projects did your company attract in the last year?

A. We are now growing rapidly internationally, including Canada. We have also become the primary products used on ammonia refrigeration systems.

Q.What is the most challenging work/contract the company has undertaken?

A. Waterproofing the Ballpark at Arlington. Solving the downhole corrosion issues in Alaska.

Q.What are the biggest obstacles to completing work your company undertakes?

A. We do nothing but manufacture, so the answer to that would be R&D and new product development and introduction.

Q.What do you see as your company's biggest challenge in the next five years?

A. Making the transition from being a good small company to a good large company.

Q.What is the average length of time employee's work for the company?





Excerpts from 'Arctic Oil' Photographs of Alaska's North Slope by Judy Patrick

When I first started taking photos in Prudhoe Bay in 1989, I was excited to finally see the place everyone called "The Slope." My husband had worked there ten years earlier during construction of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline after the giant Prudhoe discovery. I often overheard he and his friends swapping stories like they all belonged to some exclusive club. Their descriptions fascinated me: a remote, frozen landscape, roads made from ice, hotel-sized buildings that arrived on barges, and massive construction equipment.

Over the years I have photographed "The Slope" from every angle imaginable. My clients included oil producers, drilling and pipeline contractors, heavy construction companies, air carriers, and camp caterers. During all of these assignments, my goal was to capture images that would illustrate what working in the Arctic was like, and how operations were conducted in a safe and responsible manner.

One of my favorite examples of environmental protection is the "duck ponds" — bright yellow or orange plastic spill containment that is placed under every single piece of equipment or vehicle, so that any drips or leaks are captured. I joke about how much cleaner the oil fields are than your average grocery store parking lot, but it's really true.

Over time, I realized that most Alaskans had no idea where their neighbors or family members were heading when they flew north for their work rotation. Workers constantly asked me for photos they could share with friends and family back home, and that's what led me to publish this book. The Arctic is difficult to describe in words. So, for those who will never get to Deadhorse, I hope these images provide a window to a beautiful and unique place that I have grown to love.

While the passion of many Alaska photographers is wildlife, unless an animal is walking under an oil pipeline or grazing near a drilling rig, it holds little interest for Judy Patrick:The people and machines of the oil industry are what grab her and that's evident in her evocative photographs of the Arctic.

If you want to really see what the industry looks like in this little-traveled and forbidding part of North America, "Arctic Oil, photographs of Alaska's North Slope" by Judy Patrick is the best documentary you will find, partly because of Patrick's fascination with the industry and her desire to document its footprint on the land — and partly because she will go anywhere, in any weather, to shoot photographs.

She once told me that she's at her best when she's in a helicopter with the door wide open snapping pictures.

My favorites in her collection are the building of BP's Northstar Island in the Arctic Ocean off Alaska's North Slope. She shot every aspect of the oil field's development, from placing the gravel for the island to laying the pipeline to take the oil to shore.

Most important, her photos are honest. There's no photoshopping in mountains along the flat coastal plain, which at least one anti-development group is guilty of doing.

Rather, in Patrick's work the vast Arctic and industry's presence is accurately portrayed.

You will come away with an appreciation for the people and the science that protect an environment both pristine and rich in natural energy resources.





On May 23, while traveling in the southbound lane of Interstate 5, a truck hauling a heavy and oversized load struck the support structure of a bridge crossing the Skagit River in Mount Vernon, Wash. The damage inflicted by the truck caused the 160foot long four lane span to collapse into the river below, completely severing the interstate. While the truck cleared the bridge before it collapsed, two passenger vehicles caught up in the failure of the bridge were destroyed with the passengers emerging shocked and scared, but alive. Interstate 5 is the major West Coast transportation route between the United States and Canada, serving more than 70,000 vehicles per day.

Dive operations in the river were complicated by spring runoff conditions resulting in high river currents. The operations included a detailed underwater survey of the downstream edge of the wreckage to ensure that it was safe to bring demolition equipment alongside, cutting and rigging the bridge wreckage and an underwater inspection to survey for damage to the bridge piers.


